## **SUMMER NEWSLETTER 2018**

Sometimes working with nature can be a frustrating business and this year has been a case in point. With a mainly mild, wet winter and spring, many of the grasses have grown long and flowers have had to compete with them. As a result some haven't done quite so well. However, by contrast, we have had some notable success in the chalk pit. For about 3 years contractors have been opening up some of the scrub that has been taking over there. This has allowed more light into the chalk pit and this year we have seen more cowslips, round headed rampions (the Sussex Flower) and pyramidal orchids.

With the control of scrub in mind, the slope overlooking Halewick Lane has been under discussion. The South Downs National Park Ranger also arranged for contractors to work on this slope and they have cleared quite a large area. Many people have said they like the more open look, but we have to consider how to consolidate their work. For many years horses grazed on the slope which kept the scrub under control. It was noticeable how quickly and densely the scrub took over after they went. This area is particularly difficult to manage as it is a steep slope where machinery can't be used. Tom, the Ranger, has asked if some limited grazing again in this area might be considered but by a small number of docile cows rather than horses this time. This is currently under discussion by the Committee and others. The cows would be kept off the path going along the slope to prevent them getting in the way of dog walkers or having cow pats on the path.

The FOLR Committee are not against this idea in principle, although we have made it clear that this would be just one area that is otherwise difficult to manage and where we do not have the resource to make a difference. However, it is a sensitive issue and we are all clear that nothing should happen unless there is proper public consultation and it should, perhaps, be a trial to gauge how things go. If this progresses any further there is likely to be roadshow information in the car park and an opportunity for people to ask questions. In the meantime, we would be interested to hear from you, the Members, with your thoughts or concerns so that we can include them in any discussions. Please
